#### Revision of Annexes I and II to Council Directive 2002/56/EC

#### **Explanatory Note**

In order to update Annexes I and II of Council Directive 2002/56/EC and to introduce harmonised grades of seed potatoes, three separate legal acts are required:

- (1) A Commission Implementing Directive amending certain Annexes of Council Directive 2002/56/EC as regards minimum conditions to be satisfied by seed potatoes and lots of seed potatoes;
- (2) A Commission Implementing Directive determining Union grades of pre-basic, basic and certified seed potatoes, together with the conditions and designations applicable to such grades;
- (3) A Commission Implementing Decision on amending Commission Decision 2004/3/EC authorising, in respect of the marketing of seed potatoes in all or part of the territory of certain Member States, more stringent measures against certain diseases than are provided for in Annexes I and II to Council Directive 2002/56/EC.

The reasons for this approach are the following:

- (a) Article 3(1) of Council Directive 2002/56/EC states that the minimum conditions for the categories of basic and certified seed potatoes shall be laid down in Annexes I and II. In the revised version, the minimum conditions for basic or certified seed potatoes are defined as the minimum conditions applying to the lowest grade within the respective category. The minimum conditions applying to pre-basic seed potatoes (based on Article 18(c)) and the grades have to be determined in a separate legal act.
- (b) In the legal act determining minimum conditions for pre-basic seed potatoes as well as the grades for all categories, Commission Directive 93/17/EEC has to be repealed. This Commission Directive has Article 3(3) of the basic act as its legal base. This article is also the legal base to determine the new, harmonised grades for all categories. As the expert group agreed to maintain the system of high-grade regions, new grade designations and updated stricter requirements for seed potato production in these regions have to be determined as well.
- (c) Commission Decision 2004/3/EC which determines the high-grade regions has as a consequence to be amended as well.

- 1.1. Annex I to Directive 2002/56/EC shall be replaced by the following:

#### **ANNEX I**

# MINIMUM CONDITIONS TO BE SATISFIED BY BASIC AND CERTIFIED SEED POTATOES

- 1. Basic seed potatoes shall be multiplied for a maximum of four field generations. Certified seed potatoes shall be multiplied for a maximum of two field generations on the same holding.
- 2. Basic and certified seed potatoes shall satisfy the following minimum conditions concerning the tolerances to the presence of particular harmful organisms and must not exceed the maximum percentages provided below:

- 2. Determination of Union grades of pre-basic, basic and certified seed potatoes, together with the conditions and designations applicable to such grades
- 2.1. Pre-basic seed potatoes

Pre-basic seed potatoes shall satisfy the minimum conditions laid down in Annex I.

## 2.2. Grades of pre-basic, basic and certified seed potatoes

Union grades of pre-basic, basic and certified seed potatoes are hereby determined.

Seed potatoes eligible for these grades are those which qualify for the official certification as 'pre-basic seed potatoes', 'basic seed potatoes' or 'certified seed potatoes' in accordance with Articles 18(a), 2(b)i, and 2(c)i respectively of Council Directive 2002/56/EC, and which moreover satisfy the conditions specified in Annexes II and III for the relevant grade. The fulfilment of the conditions for the grades shall be established by official examination.

4. The grade shall be indicated on the official label provided for in Annex III of Council Directive 2002/56/EC under the heading 'grade'.

- 2. The crop of grades S\*, SE\* and E\* shall be raised in a production ground where three years at least have elapsed since potatoes were last grown.
- 3. The crop of grades  $S^*$ ,  $SE^*$  and  $E^*$  shall, where official field inspection is provided for, be subject to at least two official field inspections.

### 2.4. Generations of seed potatoes

- 1. Grade "PBTC" shall be given to pre-basic seed potatoes in cases where the tubers are produced from potato micropropagative material in pest-free growing medium in a facility under specified protected conditions.
- 2. The grades of pre-basic, basic and certified seed potatoes shall be multiplied over the following numbers of field generations:
- (a) PB: 1, 2, 3 or 4
- (b) S and S\*: 2, 3, 4 or 5
- (c) SE and SE\*: 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7
- (d) E and E\*: 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 or 7
- (e) A: 8 or 9
- (f) B: 8 or 9

# 2.5. Repeal

Commission Directive 93/17/EEC is hereby repealed. References to Commission Directive 93/17/EEC shall be read as references to this Directive.

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3. Amendment of Commission Decision 2004/3/EC authorising, in respect of the marketing of seed potatoes in all or part of the territory of certain Member States, more stringent measures against certain diseases than are provided for in Annexes I and II to Council Directive 2002/56/EC

Article 1 of Commission Decision 2004/3/EC is amended as follows:

- (a) Point (a) is replaced by the following: "for seed potato production to 'S\*', or 'SE\*'";
- (b) Point (b) is replaced by the following: "for potato production to 'S\*', 'SE\*' or 'E\*'".
